INTRO

Rob began our time together reminding us that Paul was recruiting prayer warriors in the Thessalonian church to pray strength and protection for the workers that had been sent—praying that the message of Jesus would spread rapidly and with honor. Prayer is a significant and vital part of the Kingdom of God's growth. IDEA 1

In this passage (2 Thessalonians 3), Paul called out some early Christians in this church who had stopped working because they expected Jesus's imminent return.

While our context is different, what are some ways we might neglect our earthly responsibilities or relationships because of misapplied spiritual beliefs?

Rob shared that in response to this issue, Paul was practicing church discipline through tough love. However, ultimately Paul wanted restoration, not just punishment, when dealing with idle believers.

How can we practice "tough love" in a way that leads to restoration rather than alienation in our church community?

What might this look like practically?

IDEA 2

Rob discussed the tension between care and enablement in Christian community.

Share about a time when you had to find this balance—either as someone helping others or receiving help yourself. What did you learn from that experience?

Paul told the Thessalonians to "never get tired of doing good" even when facing potential abuse of generosity.

What makes it challenging to maintain generosity after experiencing disappointment?

How can we sustain a generous spirit while being wise stewards?

Rob mentioned that churches sometimes "punt" their responsibility to care for communities to the government.

What unique contributions can local churches make in caring for community needs that other institutions cannot?
